


The Hotel Ascona

The Hotel Ascona is surrounded by nature and set amidst tranquil private gardens replete with subtropical plants.

The available spaces are: 800 m2 of modular rooms equipped for study rooms, seminar rooms, conferences, congresses, banquets, receptions, projections and other activities upon request.


68 bedrooms, 3 restaurants, swimming pool, sauna, jacuzzi, massage rooms, small gym space, park and and national park directly accessible from the facility.





The activities

- * The Theosophical Research Centre at the Hotel Ascona regularly hosts the meetings and the Seminars of the Theosophical Society, there is a large Theosophical Library and the Archivio Luigi Pericle.
- The Centre is surrounded by nature and is also a walking destination.
- * The Centre is situated near locations steeped in charm such as the Monte Verità, Eranos, the Museo di Arte Moderna in Ascona, the Fondazione Marguerite Arp and the Fondazione Remo Rossi.
- * The purpose of the initiative is to promote study of Theosophy, spirituality, art and their expressions, as well as their role in culture and social events for development and improvement.


A long-standing Theosophical tradition

Ascona, an idyllic fishing village, now a well-known tourist centre surrounded by nature, from the beginning of the 20th century was a crossroads of cultures and meeting place for some of the century's greatest cultural figures.

In the late 1800s Alfredo Pioda, theosophist, politician, from Locarno was the moral initiator of the history of Monte Verità Mounth of the Truth). Pioda owned the land on which Monte Verità stands and intended to found a secular convent of Theosophical inspiration with the help of Franz Hartmann and the Baron Constance Wachtmeister.

Hartmann was the Blavatsky's closest confidant and finally administrative director of the Theosophical Society's headquarters in Adyar.

Wachtmeister was a friend and collaborator of Helena Petrovna Blavatsky from 1885 until HPB's death in 1891. She taught extensively in the 1890s and helped Annie Besant form lodges in the United States after the American schism by Judge (one of the founders).



Alfredo Pioda, Franz Hartmann and the Baron Constance Wachtmeister literally prepared the ground for what was later to be the settlement of the first vegetarian settlers.

The alternative and vegetarian colony of the early twentieth century marked the birth of the myth of Monte Verità, with the presence of artists, anarchists, philosophers and thinkers, as well as illustrious guests such: Hermann Hesse, David H. Lawrence, James Joyce, the Dadaists, Marianne von Werefkin, Alexej von Jawlensky.

Olga Fröbe-Kapteyn creating the Cercle (Tagung) Eranos. From 1933 onwards, the meetings were animated by Carl Gustav Jung in the company of some of the leading intellectuals of the time, included Kerényi, Müller, Scholem and the art curator Sir Herbert Read, who was a guest speaker at the Tagung from 1953 to 1964.








An artistic hub

Between 1950 and 1970, several internationally renowned artists settled in the area of Ascona.

These artists were Jean Arp, Raphael Benazzi, Julius Bissier, Ben Nicholson, Hans Richter, Italo Valenti and Luigi Pericle, who were joined by many others who were very close to them, starting with Mark Tobey, or Walter Helbig and Fritz Glarner, who also resided in the area for varying lengths of time.




Luigi Pericle

Pericle Luigi Giovannetti was born in Basel on 22 June 1916.

His father, Pietro Giovannetti, was from Italy, while his mother, Eugénie Rosé, was of French origins.





Self-taught studies

Pericle receiving his first commission for a painting when he was only twelve.


He was self-taught, spoke Italian, German, English, French, Greek (he read Homer in the original language), studying Chinese, Japanese and other languages.

He becoming well versed in Zen, Chinese and Japanese thinking, as well as those of ancient Egypt and Greece.












The artist signed his illustrations under the surname Giovannetti.








The illustrator


Calligraphy would be a source of inspiration to Pericle throughout his career.

The radical change


In 1959 Pericle destroying all but one of the figurative paintings works from his early years.


He moved on to informal abstractionism and specialized in secret working techniques.












A mysterious technique


In 1966, one year after his retirement from the world of art, Luigi Pericle changed his painting medium from canvas to Masonite.
















The art world

The collectors

Luigi Pericle exhibiting with Appel, Sam Francis, Jorn, Tàpies, Dubuffet, Riopelle, Michaux and Picasso. His paintings were bought by many famous collectors, including the family of the Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home, Brigitte Helm (protagonist of of Fritz Lang's cult film *Metropolis*), the Member of Parliament Sir Basil de Ferranti, Peter G. Staechelin, Bennet Korn and Helmut Kindler.


With the support of Herbert Read and the Arts Council, Hans Hess, museologist and curator at the York Art Gallery, organized a solo Luigi Pericle touring exhibition in 1965, which visited several British museums including York, Newcastle, Hull, Bristol, Cardiff and Leicester.



The Secret Years

In late 1965, at the peak of his success, Luigi Pericle abruptly withdrew from the art world. He was no longer in the public eye and he produced a large number of works.







Evolutionary horoscope, hand drawn by Luigi Poricle, undated. Archivic Luigi

The esoteric matters





The Archive is located at the Hotel Ascona, also the headquarters of the Swiss Theosophical Research Center.




The spread






French Academy in Rome – Villa Medici
